

Pension Application for Ezekiel Buckbee

Application in order to obtain pension under the act of 1832, War of the Revolution.

State of New Jersey

County of Passaic SS.

On this twenty second day of January A.D. eighteen hundred and fifty two before me, John H. Debow a Justice of the Peace in and for the County of Passaic personally appeared Ezekiel Buckbee aged eighty eight years a resident of the County of Passaic and State of New Jersey who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed.

That he entered the service of the United States as a volunteer on or about the last of May A.D. seventeen hundred and eighty one in the company commanded by Captain Duboise in the Regiment of New York Troops under command of Colonel Brinkerhoff for three months. That he served during the whole of said period under said Captain Duboise and was honorably discharged on or about the first of September A.D. 1781. He thinks he received a certificate for fathful services, but does not know where it is from the great length of time, when he volunteered his place of residence was in Dutchess County State of New York, during the whole of this service he was in and about Fort Montgomery.

He further declares that immediately after the expiration of the above mentioned service he again volunteered in a company of Rangers commanded by Captain Comfort Ludonton and Lieutenant John Robinson in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Henry Ludonton for the term of three months and continued in actual service under said officers for the whole term of three months and was honorably discharged and he thinks he received a certificate for faithful service at the time from his officers but from the length of time elapsed he cannot state with certainty, but that is his present impression.

That he also served for about one month in one other company the officers of which he cannot now recollect. He further declares he has made diligent search (having traveled some hundreds of miles) for the purpose of finding some of his old fellow soldiers without success except one and he is insane as he recollects well the names of the following persons who served with him under Captain Duboise, Vizt: Daniel Canfield, Ezra Canfield, James Fettelton, Thomas Fetteelton, Isaac Doty, Levi Mead, Levi Winter and Samuel Buckbee, and of those who served with him under Captain Ludonton, he well remembers the names of Daniel Canfield, Titus Canfield, Ezra Canfield, Lewis Mead, Enoch Robinson, Elijah Springg, and Nathaniel Finch on enquiry he is informed and believes his name and the names of the officers under whom he served is herein stated and on the Revolutionary Rolls at Albany in the State of New York.
