

Bounty Land for William Bull

Letter in Folder dated March 14, 1928, written in response to an inquiry.

I advise you that from the records of this Bureau it appears that Warrant Number 160 for three hundred acres of bounty land was issued December 15, 1790 on account of the services of William Bull, Captain in the New York Line, War of the Revolution.

There are no further data on file as to his services and no data as to his family, owing to the destruction of papers in such claims when the War Office was burnined in November 1800.

The Revolutionary War records of this Bureau fail to afford any information in regard to Abraham, Samuel, Isaac, or Peter Bull, or to John Bull as described by you, or to any Lawrence Dutcher. Referring to the last named soldier who you state also served in a campaign in 1758, this Bureau has no record of services rendered in the Colonies prior to the Revolution.
