

**Pension Application for Henry Burdick**

On the sixteenth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighteen came personally before me Robert Clark Esquire one of the Judges of the court of Common Pleas in & for said county Henry Burdick (to me known) and being duly sworn did depose and say that on the twenty seventh day of May one thousand seven hundred & seventy seven he entered the service of the United States by enlisting into a company of infantry under Capt. Jacob Wright in the Second Regiment—New York Line commanded by Col. Phillip VanCourtland.

That he served in said Regiment & Company during the turn of six years at the end of which time which was the fourth of June one thousand seven hundred and eighty three he received an honourable discharge which is herewith inclosed.

That by reason of sickness and the feeble state of his constitution he is in such reduced circumstances as to absolutely require the assistance of his county for support. (Signed) Henry Burdick
