

### **Bounty Land for Robert R. Burnet**

B.L.Wt.173-200-Lieut of Col. Lamb's regt art. Issued Sept 15, 1790. No papers.

Letter in folder dated December 10, 1935, written in response to an inquiry.

Reverence is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Lieutenant or Major Robert Burnet, whose name was placed on the pension roll of New York in 1826.

The records of this office show that Robert Burnett, or Robert R. Burnet, applied for pension under the Act of May 15, 1828, at which time he was a resident of Orange County, New York. The claim was for service as lieutenant in Colonel Lamb's regiment of Continental Artillery, his service terminating at the close of the Revolutionary War.

In the Report of the Secretary of War in regard to the Pension Establishment, printed in 1835, it is shown that Robert Burnett received a pension at the rate of \$400 per annum under the Act of May 15, 1828 and that his name was placed on the New York pension roll August 5, 1828.

The records of this office show, also, that warrant No. 173 for 200 acres of bounty land was issued September 15, 1790, on account of service of Robert R. Burnet as lieutenant in Colonel Lamb's regiment of Continental Artillery, the service terminating at the close of the Revolutionary War. This officer died 29, 1854.
