

Pension Application for Zebulon Cables or Cable

W.9380 (Widow: Catharine) Zebulon Cables died September 18, 1838. Married October 27, 1773 Zebulon Cabols and Catharina Shoneman, the marriage appeared in the records of the Reformed Protestant Dutch Church of the City of Albany..

On this ninth day of October 21 personally appeared in open court being a court of Record for the said County Zebulon Cable, aged eighty three years resident in Bainbridge in said County, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows.;

He served in Captain David VanNess' company in Colonel VanSchaick's Regiment in the New York line on the Continental Establishment. And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of march 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War, passed on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and my me subscribed.

That this declarant is entirely unable to pursue any business, owing to infirmity & old age. That his family consists of himself and wife aged sixty one years, who for three years has been unable from sickness to do any labour. Also Peggy a daughter of the declarant aged thirty one years who goes out to [?] (Signed with his mark) Zebulon Cable

Sworn to and declared on this 9th day of October 1821 before Wm Tossy, John Noyes and Tilly Lynde, Judges of said Court in open court.

A schedule of all the property of Zebulon Cables of Bainbridge in the County of Chenang & State of New York a pensioner under the Act of congress of the 18th of March 1818 (Viz) 1 Tea pot, 1 cow, 1 meat barrel, 4 pigs, 1 pail, 1 old axe, 1 great wheel, 1 hoe, 1 small wheel, 6 knives & forks, 1 bottle, 1 pot 1 kettle, 1 Jack Knife, 5 chairs, 1 pitch fork, 1 table, 1 frying pan, 1 chest, 1 pr tongs, 6 cups & saucers, 1/4 acre potatoes, 3 earthen plates, 1 acre of corn, 1 looking glass, a quantity of garden vegetables. Excepting necessary clothing & bedding. Dated Oct 9th 1820. (Signed with his mark) Zebulon Cables. Chenango County SS. Perez Randall Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of said County.
