

Pension Application for Samuel Carman or Carmans

W.6904 (Widow: Polly)

State of New York

Albany County

On this eleventh day of August 1820 personally appeared in open court, (being a court of record in and for the said State according to the solemn adjudications of the Supreme Court of this state, and being a court which proceeds according to the course of common law, with a jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount, keeping a record of its proceedings, and possessing the power of fine and imprisonment: Samuel Carman aged fifty-five years, resident in the Town of Westerlo in said County, who being duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath declare, that he served in the revolutionary war as follows:--

Enlisted in September one thousand seven hundred and eighty two served in Captain Austin's Company and VanSchaicks Regiment and was discharged by Colonel Philip VanCortland that the number of his pension certificate is 15,150 & that his original Declaration is dated the twenty eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred & eighteen.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war," passed on the 18th of March , 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed.

Viz—four shirts two cloth coats three pair of linen pantaloons two pair of woollen pantaloons two vests one pair of shoes two pair of stockings one handkerchief one wool hat one over coat and one chest. (Signed) Samuel Carman
