

**Pension Application for Samuel Carson**

On this twenty fifth day of May 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Chenango who being first by me duly sworn according to law doth on his [oath] make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and Naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war.—

That he the said Samuel Carson enlisted in Rochester in the County of Ulster and State of New York in a Company commanded by Capt Cornelius Hardenbergh in a Regiment commanded by Colonel Richard in the month of March in the year 1776 for the term of nine months and continued to serve in said corps in the service to the United States until about the twenty fifth day [of] December 1776, when he was duly discharged from service at White Plains in the State of New York in the year 1776. And that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support. And that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
