

Pension Application for Joseph Charthie

On this twenty ninth day of May 1818 before me Stephen Phelps a Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for said County personally appeared Joseph Charthie aged 55 years resident in the Town of Groveland, in the County of Ontario, who being by me first duly sworn doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and navil [naval] service of the United States in the Revolutionary War. That he enlisted in the spring or summer of the year 1780 at Fishkill in the State of New York in the Continental Service during the war, in the company commanded by Captain Oliver in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Moses Hazen in the New York line or what was then called the Congress Regiment and that he continued to serve in the said corps in the United States service until the close of the war and received an honorable discharge in New Winson [Windsor] in the State of New York in the month of June 1783 and that he was in no general battle and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that having lost his discharge by being burned together with his house he has no other evidence now in his power of said services. Letter in file dated Jany 20, 1910, written in response to an inquiry.

Joseph Charthie, Sur. File No. 40,828, was allowed pension on his application executed May 29, 1818 while fifty-five years of age and a resident of Groveland, Ontario County, New York.

He stated that he enlisted at Fishkill, New York, in the Spring of 1780, and served as a Private in Captain Olivie's company of Colonel Moses Hazen's 2d Canadian or Congress' Own Regiment, until the summer of 1783, and that he was in no general battle.

In 1820 he resided at Freeport, New York, and referred to his wife aged fifty-five years, (name not given), and children, Peter twelve years, Daniel ten years, and Jane eight years.

In 1839 he resided in Crawford County, Pennsylvania.
