

### Pension Application for Seth Cary

R.1682

Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

At a Court of Chancery, held in and for the State of New York, now sitting at Onondaga. Present, Daniel Mosely Esqr Vice Chancellor of the Seventh Circuit of the State of New York.

State of New York

Onondaga County SS.

On this 23<sup>rd</sup> day of October in the year 1832 personally appeared in open court before the said Vice Chancellor Seth Cary, a resident of the Town of Salina in said County, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act passed June 7, 1832, his age being 76 years.

Than he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers & served as herein stated.

That he first [??] the service under a draft, at Maple town in Vermont and served under Captain John Johnson it was in the forepart of the year and in the fall of the same year, that he went to Fort Edward staid there as a private soldier three month[s] under Major Abbott, he then returned home.

That the next spring after he was called out by Captain Brown in the Malitia [militia], the particular year he cannot recollect that he went to Fort George, but did not arrive there until the British had taken over the Fort and fired it, he then returned back, was gone one month.

And that he was called out and went to Skenesborough, and served under Captain Powell and served two months and was relieved, and went home, and that was in the last of the winter, the same year that the place was taken, which happened in a few days after he left.

And that he was at Fort Edward at one other time and served two months and that he at the first of his said services enrolled his name in the Malitia as a minute man and stood as such during the war and was in actual service and called out very often and served short periods against the Indians and Tories, which particular times she cannot designate, but that he considered himself in service all the time as he was enlisted as a minute man.

That he never received an written discharge, that he thinks he was there in the service as much as four years and that he has no written evidence of his said services, and he knows no living witness by whom he can prove his said services.

That he was born near Quaker Hill in the Country of Dutchess in the State of New York in the year 1756 according to a record he has at home, that he resided at Mapletown in Vermont when he was first called into the service, after the war he moved to Lackawana, in Pennsylvania, then to [?] in the State of New York then to the town of Salina where he now lives and that he is known to Henry Case and Allen D. Kinney who can testify for him.

He hereby relinquishes every claim what ever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. (Signed with his mark) Seth Cary
