

Pension Application for Cemaur Chartier

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of the act entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the Army of the Revolution" approved on the 15th day May 1828. I Cemaur Chartier of Chazy in the county of Clinton in the State of New York. He hereby declares that he enlisted in the continental line of the army of the revolution for and during the war and continued in its service until its termination at which period I was a private in Captain Augustine [Lewis's?] company in James Livingston's Regiment of the New York Line. And I also declare that I afterwards received a receipt or certificate but whether it was a record of eighty dollars or for [?] pay I cannot say as it with all my papers was burned with my house about seven years ago.

And I further declare that I was not on the 15th day of May 1828 on the pension list of the United States.
