

Pension Application for Isaac Christiance

Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress passed the 7th June 1832.

State of New York

Saratoga County SS.

On this seventeenth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty two personally appeared before me Harvey Granger Esquire one of the Judges of the court of Common Pleas of the said County of Saratoga at the dwelling house of John Christiance in the town of Northumberland in said County of Saratoga Isaac Christiance a resident of the said town of Northumberland aged sixty nine years; who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed 7th June 1832.

That he enlisted in the army of the United States in the fore part of September (cannot state the day of the month in the year 1779 or 1780 in the company of Capt. John Wendell for during the war and served in the first Regiment of the New York State line Regimental Officers Colonel ---- VanSchaick, Lieut. Col. Van Dyke. Company officers Capt. John Wendell's Ensign Christopher Miller. The other Regimental and company officers he does not recollect. The said Regiment was a part of Major Genl. Clinton's Brigade. That he served until some time in April following seven months or more when his father procured his discharge by paying a sum of money to procure a substitute.

That during his said term of service he was stationed at the City of Albany and its vicinity in the State of New York.

That at the time of his entering the service as aforesaid he resided at (what is now) the City of Schenectady in the State of New York.

That he had a discharge from the service but is not lost as he believes it has been burnt by accident.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state. (Signed with his mark)
