

### Pension Application for John Clark

Land Warrant No. 6899 for 100 acres, issued Sept. 5, 1791 to John Clark who was a Sergt, Capt. Kill's comp'y, 2<sup>nd</sup> Regt, N.Y. Cont'l line.

The State of New York granted to the above Serg't Clark, Lot No. 80 in Township No. 16 for 600 acres, on the 8<sup>th</sup> July 1790.

Land Warrant No. 7005 for 100 acres, issued July 16, 1790 to Wm. I. Vreedenburgh assignee of Jno. Clark a private, Col. Lamb's Regt. N.Y. line.

Land warrant No. 7009 for 160 acres, issued March 15, 1791 to John Clark also a private of Col. Lamb's Artillery.

State of New York

County of Livingston SS.

Be it known that on the sixth day of August A.D. 1853 before the County Court of Livingston County, State of New York personally appeared John Clark aged 96 years a resident of Geneseo County of Livingston, State of New York, who being duly cautioned and then sworn doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of the act of congress passed June the 9<sup>th</sup> 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of December or there about under an enlistment as a Sergeant in Colonel James Livingston's Regiment, Captain Ten Eyck's Company to serve during the war and was reduced November 1778 and was restored March the 4<sup>th</sup> 1779 and was mustered to January 1782 and that for said service he received from the State of New York a Military Bounty lot of land in the town of Ovid containing 600 acres and was discharged from Captain Samuel Pell's company Second New York Regiment but his discharge is lost. He further says he is now so old and broken that his memory has failed him so that he does not remember more fully the particulars of the service he done.

And he further states that he hereby relinquishes every other claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and declares that his name is not on the pension roll of the agency of any state. (Signed with his mark) John Clark
