Revolutionary Claims

Form of a Declaration to be made by the Non-Commissioned Officers, Musicians, and Privates.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the act, entitled, "an act for the relief of certain surviving Officers and Soldiers of the Army of the Revolution," approved on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1828, I, Ichabod Coe of the City of Hudson in the county of Columbia in the State of New York do hereby declare, that I enlisted in the Continental Line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war, and continued in its service until its termination; at which period, I was a fifer in Captain McGowan's (as I think) company, in the Invalid Regiment, of the Continental Line. And, I also declare, that I afterwards received no continental certificates for the reward of eighty dollars; to which I was entitled, under a resolve of Congress, passed the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1778. I have understood they were issued – but I don't recollect receiving them.

And I further declare, that I was not on the fifteenth day of May 1828, on the Pension List of the United States, nor have I at any time since, been on any pension roll.

West my hand, this twelfth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight. (Signed) Ichabod Coe

Before me Fletcher M. Beekman of the City of Hudson in the county of Columbia in the State of New York personally appeared this day, I Charles Darling and John Dayton of the said county, who did severally make oath that Ichabod Coe by whom the foregoing declaration was subscribed, is generally reputed and believed to have been a soldier in the Army of the Revolution, in manner as herein stated.
