

Pension Application for Cornelius Coneway

On this twenty seventh day of April 1818 before me the subscriber first Judge of the Court of Common Pleas of Ulster County personally appears Cornelius Coneway aged 70 years resident in the Town of Hurly in the said County of Ulster who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war".

That eh the said Cornelius Coneway enlisted in the State of New York in the month of May 1778 for nine months in the company commanded by Captain Edward Lounsberry Colonel VanCortlandt's Regiment, that he continued to serve in the said corps or in the service of the United States until the expiration of the said nine months when he was discharged from service in in Warwasink in the State of New York, that he has been in no battles, and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
