

Pension Application for William Conner or Connor

Onondaga County SS.

On the fifth day of September 1820, personally appeared in open court in the court of common pleas in and for the county of Onondaga, being a court of record proceeding according to the course of the common law, with a jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount, and keeping a record of their proceedings, William Conner aged sixty two years, resident in the town of Salina in said county, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:--that he enlisted early in the spring of the year 1778, in Captain Pells Company in Col. VanCortland's Regiment. Joined the army at Valley Forge was in the battle of Monmouth and was discharged at Wawarsing in Ulster County about the first of February 1779, that he is a pensioner of the United States & his certificate is No. 2,581 and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts, or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed.

A Schedule of the estate of William Conner above named except the necessary articles of clothing, to wit, one pair of spectacles \$0.50. On Tobacco box .50. \$1.00

That he is disabled by age & infirmities from labor so far as to be unable to support himself without public or private charity. (Signed with his mark) William Conner
