

Pension Application for Isaac Crannel

W.22861 (Maria: Widow) Married November 24, 1789, Isaac died October 8, 1825.

State of New York

Rensselaer County SS.

On this 26th day of May 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in said County, personally appears Isaac Crannel aged fifty nine years, resident in the City of Troy in the said County who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:" That he the said Isaac Crannel enlisted first in April 1776, he thinks, in Albany in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain Smith (but was enlisted by Capt. Brooks of the 4th Regiment commanded by Col. Weisenvelt of the New York Line that he continued to serve in the said Corps, or in the service of the United States until the middle of January 1777 when he was discharged from service in or near Morristown, State of New Jersey.

That he was in the battle of General Sullivan with the Indians near Cayuga Point in New York, that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
