

Pension Application for Nathan Davis

On this first day of June 1820 before me the subscriber First Judge of the Court of common Pleas in & for the County of Onondaga personally appeared Nathan Davis who on his oath declares that he is the same person who formerly belonged to the company commanded by Captain Aaron Austin in the regiment commanded by Colonel Gansvoort in the service of the United States; that his name was placed on the pension roll of the State of New York about twenty eight years since under the act of congress passed the twenty third day of March 1792—and has received his pension up to the fourth day of March 1819.

That he has been paid after [sic] the rate of eight dollars per month since the passage of the act of Congress of the 18th March 1818.

That he never had any certificate of the fact of his having been placed on the pension roll of the United States but he is now informed from the agency of the United States for paying pensions in the City of New York that no payment will be made of said pension until this deponent shall obtain a certificate of his being placed on the pension roll of the United States & further saith not. (Signed) Nathan Davis
