

**Pension Application for Richard Davis**

Richard Davis being duly sworn doth depose & say that he was a regular enlisted soldier in the army of the American Revolution & served as a soldier in a company of Artillary [Artillery] under the command of Captain Joseph Savage, Second New York Regiment of Artillary under the command of Colonel Lamb (the Christian name of said Colonel not recollected) for the term of two years & seven months and until the close of war when this deponent received his discharge from General George Washington to wit the ninth day of June 1783.

And this deponent further saith that on or about the year 1784 he this deponent sold and gave up to one Irael [Israel] Rogers his discharge aforesaid mentioned, since which time he this deponent has not heard or seen any further of his said discharge \* this deponent further saith that from his reduced circumstances he needs the assistance of his country for support, and further saith not.
