

Pension Application for Squire Davis

On this third day of November AD 1832 personally appears before me first Judge of the Court of Common Pleas in & for the County of Cayuga & State of New York Squire Davis mentioned in the annexed declaration who being duly sworn doth on his oath make the following declaration in addition and supplementary to his said declaration hereto annexed.

That he was born in the town of Horseneck in the County of Fairfield & State of Connecticut in the month of June AD 1750 (as appears by a record now in his possession kept in the family bible) where he lived until he was about eight years old when he removed with his father to the City of New York, where he continued to reside until he was about twenty one years of age from thence he removed to the town of Armenia in the County of Dutchess & State of New York where he continued to reside until nearly the close of the Revolutionary War when he removed to the County of Washington where he continued to reside about twenty years when he removed to the County of Cayuga in said State where he has continued to reside ever since & where he now resides. That the Rev. John C. Rudd & John Grover Esq who have subscribed & sworn to the annexed certificate both live in the same town and neighbourhood with him—that the names of the regiment and company officers under whom he served are set forth in said declaration so far as he is able to remember the same—and also the general circumstances of said service—that by reason of old age and the consequent loss of memory he is unable to state more particularly than he has doen the particulars of his said service.
