

Pension Application for Samuel Dean or Deen

On this sixteenth Day of February one thousand eight hundred and nineteen before the subscriber, the first Judge of the County of Rockland Personally appeared Samuel Deen aged sixty two the first day of June insuing resident in the County of Rockland in said Districk [sic] who being by me first sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of congress intituled an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War that he the said Samuel Deen enlisted in Albany City in the State of New York in the company by Capt. James Grage of the third Regiment New York line in the year one thousand seven hundred & seventy seven, that he continued to serve in the said Corp & in the service of the United State[s] utnill the close of the war when he was discharged from service in the County of Orange, was then in Captain Henry Teabout Company, State of New York that he was in the Battle at Fort Standvich and that he was on the Western Expedition with General Sullivan and at the taking of Lord Cornwallis and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of assistance of his country for support and that he has no other evidence but Joseph Sheldon which is hereunto [?] and can have no other in his power of his service.
