

Pension Application for John Delanoy

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

On this fourteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and fifty five personally appeared before me a commissioner of deeds within and for the County and State aforesaid, Margaret Levin aged fifty nine years a resident of Jersey City, State of New Jersey who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration. That she together with Betsey Mercer, Sophia VanWinkle, Parmelia H. Arento & Eliza Jones, whose declaration is hereto annexed are the only heirs at law of John Delancy, late of the City of New York, deceased. That the said John Delanoy was the father of the said applicants and herself, that he served in the war of the revolution of the United States. That early in the year 1774 he volunteered and joined Colonel John Lasher's Regiment, first Battalion of Volunteers & had for his Captain a Mr. Fleming who had been a Major in a British Regiment.

The above applicant further says that she has no documentary evidence and that she knows of no person whose testimony she can procure who can testify to such service.

She hereby relinquishes ever claim whatever to any pension monies or annuity except the present and declares that neither the said John Delanoy during his life time or these applicants ever received any pension monies on account of such service.
