Pension Application for Isaac Deman or Denman

Personally appeared before me the undersigned, a Justice of the Peace in and for the said County of Orange, Isaac Denman of Wallkill in the said County of Orange, an applicant for a pension under the act of Congress of the 7th of June 1832, who being duly sworn deposeth and saith, that by reason of old age and the consequent loss of memory he cannot swear positively as to the precise length of his service, but according to the best of his recollection, he served not less than the periods mentioned below, and in the following grades, for two months, for one month, for three months, for two months, for one month & fifteen days, for four months, and for two months as stated in my declaration to which this affidavit is affixed, and whereas I have set forth in my declaration that the periods for which served was about the time specified therein and this deponent further saith that upon the most mature & deliberate reflection thereon he feels confident that the statements made in my said declaration as it respects my services, as a private in the Revolutionary War are correct, as it respects the Col who commanded the companies in which I served, I will state the same as said forth as my recollection serves—and also the periods of the war in which I served—

The four first terms of my service in Capt Vail's company was in Col McLaughlin's regiment the term which he served in Capt Steward's Company was in Col. Cantine's Regiment, my several services which I performed as one of a class, was in Capt Vail's company in Col. McLaughling's regiment and a part of the time of my service—

The regiment was commanded by Col. Newkirk my last term of service in Capt Vail's company was also in Col McLaughling's Regiment my two first terms mentioned in my declaration was performed in the year 1776 and the two next terms of service was performed in the year 1777.—and my two next terms of service was in the years 1778 & 1779 and my last term of service in Capt'n Vail's company was in the year 1780—and this deponent further saith, that he served with an embodied corps—called into service by competent authority that he was either in the field or in garrison, and for the time during which the service was performed, he was not employed in any civil pursuit.
