## **Pension Application for Nathan Dike**

Continental (N.Y.) Nathan enlisted September or October 1776 at Mount Independence, NY, served in Captain Gideon Brownson's Company, Colonel Seth Warner's Continental Regiment, for three years and was discharged at Lake George.

State of New York Jefferson County SS

On this sixth day of July 1820 personally appeared in open court, being a court of record by a law of said state for the said county Nathan Dike aged sixty five years, resident in Leroy in said county, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:

In a regiment command[ed] by Capt Gideon Brunson that his first application and declaration was made on the tenth day of April 1818, that the number of his pension certificate is 4640—and also made and subscribed the following affidavit.

And I do solemnly swear that I as a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War, passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed.

1 yoke of steers bot [bought] on credit 24 dolls paid—1 cow yearling heifer—2 claves, 2 sheep, 3 hogs bot about 80.00 each 3 pigs month old, 2 axes, 2 hoes, 1 scythe, 2 rakes, 1 pickle, 1 old plow,1 old pine chest—1 broken dish kettle – 1 tea kettle, 1 cracked bake pan, 1 small broken kettle, one fine pail kettle—one old fire shovel, 2 pails, 1 tub—1 old churn==2 earthen pans—1 platter, 1 tea pot, 3 bowls—6 knives & forks—6 spoons, 4 plates, 1 table 3 old chairs—several of the above articles I have bought on credit—and I owe towards them fifty dollars besides the amt due on the steers.
