

Pension Application for Daniel Dod or Dodd

On this eighth day of April one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the circuit court of the United States for the said District, personally appeared Daniel Dodd aged sixty four years, resident in Saddle River Township, Bergen County in the said District, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late Act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War".

That he the said Daniel Dodd enlisted sometime in the month of April or May AD 1775, in the City of New York in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain Jacob J. Wyncoop of the Regiment commanded by Colonel Courtlandt in General McDougals Brigade of the New York Line.

That he continued to serve in the said Corps, in the service of the United States for six months, (being the time of his enlistment), when he was discharged at Lake George in the State of New York. That he was in the Battle of Ticonderoga during said term of service.

That this deponent afterwards, to wit, in the month of December A.D. 1776 enlisted in the company commanded by Captain Stephen Steele of the Regiment commanded by Colonel Hughes of the Artificers, that he continued in said Corps until the 17 of October 1777—when he was disabled by a wound received at the Nine Partners in the State of New York by a fall from a waggon transporting military impliments when he was discharged at said Nine Partners; that he afterwards received a written discharge which he has since lost.

That he now receives a pension of two dollars and fifty dollars and fifty cents per month under the act of Congress of April 18, 18[blot] in consequence of being disabled, as aforesaid.

That in case this deponent should be allowed a pension under the act of Congress of March 18, 1818 aforesaid, he hereby relinquishes his claim to the said pension heretofore allowed him as aforesaid, and this deponent further saith that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support. And that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
