

Pension Application for Frederick Dolhagin

To the Honorable Richard Riker Recorder of the City of New York, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, called the Mayor's Court of the City of New York, which is a court of Record of the State of New York.

The Declaration under the oath of Fradrick Dolhagin formerly as soldier engaged in the Service of the United States, and resident of the City of New York aforesaid –

Respectfully Sheweth, that the said Fradrick Dolhagin inlisted as a soldier sometime on the month of Feb'y 1776 for one year in Captain John Johnson's Company in Colo Olender McDougalls Regiment from the State of New York that I served until the end of my inlistment and was discharged in Feby 1777 at Peekskill but my discharge I have lost, having served one whole year in the United States service in action on Long Island and one at White Plains.

I am now about 69 years of age.

And this declaration further representeth that the said Fradrick Colhagin is not a Citizen of the United States and residing in the New York aforesaid, and is by reason of his reduced circumstances in life, in need of assistance from his country for support;

Therefore he conceives himself entitled to the benefit of the Act of the Congress of the United States, entitled, "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval Service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," approved, March 18, 1818, and requests that your Honor will examine into the truths of the matters aforesaid, certify and transit the testimony in this case, and the proceedings had thereon to the Honorable the Secretary of the Department of War, to the end that such relief may be had in the premises, as is by law in such case provided. And in support of the facts above set forth, he refers to the Statement of himself and of W. William Mooney, hereafter set forth and that his [?] Christian who were both in the same company with me. Dated the 6th day of March 1819.
