

Pension Application for Cornelius Doty

On this First day of July AD 1851 personally appeared before me Charles The Deissner, a Justice of the Peace of the County of Waukesha and State of Wisconsin, Anna Tubbs, a resident of Waukesha County, and State of Wisconsin, age seventy three years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7th 1832. I Anna Tubbs am the only Daughter and the only heir of Cornelius Doty, who was appointed and commissioned a captain of a militia company near where he resided in the County of Albany in the State of New York State, & accompanying Captain commission, dated Council of Applicant at Poughkeepsie Fourth April second year of our Independence and in the year of our Lord 1778 and passed the secretary office July 4, 1778, and passed the secretary office July 4, 1778. Captain Cornelius Doty immediately[ly] took command of the said militia company in the month of July 1778 was where he resided in the County of Albany in the State off New York, that was attached to a regiment, whereof Lewis VanWoert was Colonel Captain Cornelius Doty served in army during the remainder of the Revolutionary War, from sometime in July 1778 until the close of the war.

I believe Captain Cornelius Doty was promoted to Major and from Major to Colonel during the Revolutionary Was Captain Cornelius Doty in several Battles during the Revolutionary War, I cannot find any of Captain Cornelius Doty Commissions, except the Captain Commission which I send to you with those papers. The Major Commission was destroyed about nine years ago. See accompanying affidavits. On that point I have always understood that Captain Cornelius Doty served in the Revolutionary War and was an honor to himself and his country. I want what may be his due either in money and land, or in both. I had drather have the whole in money.

Captain Cornelius Doty died in the Month of February AD 1799, in the Town of Western in Oneida County in the State of New York.

I hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present.
