

Pension Application for John Duba

Letter in file dated November 5, 1929, written in reply to an inquiry.

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, S.45349, it appears that John Duba, enlisted, place not stated, in October 1777, as a private in Captain Orland or Arland's Company in Colonel James Livingston's New York Regiment, was in the battle of Rhode Island and served four years, after which he joined Captain Gosselin's Company, Colonel Moses Hazen's "Congress" Regiment, was at the taking of Cornwallis and served two and one-half years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 1, 1818, at which time he was aged sixty years and resided in Greensburgh, Westchester County, New York.

He died May 10, 1826.

There are no data as to his family.

Stephen Duba was a resident of New York City in 1818, no relationship stated.
