

### **Pension Application for Barnet Dutcher**

R.3168 (Widow: Charity)

State of New York

Putnam County SS.

On this eighth day of June in the year 1820 personally appeared in the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Putnam in open court the same being a court of Record and created such by Statute of the said State and proceeding according to the laws of the Common Law with unlimited Jurisdiction as to amount Barnet Dutcher aged sixty three years resident in the town of Phillipstown in said County of Putnam, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows, to wit.

That he enlisted in the Autumn of 1775 under Captain Samuel Sackett Col. Benedicts Regiment New York Line in which line and Regiment he continued during the war in the Companies commanded by Captain Samuel Sackett and Henry Tiebout and under Colonels Benedict and Philip Cortlandt, the regiment being the fourth was at the battle of St. Johns and others the assault on Quebeck [sic Quebec] [?]

That the date of his original declaration is the fourth day of April 1818, and the number of his pension Certificate 7642.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act of provide for certain persons engaged in the law and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary war", passed on the eighteenth day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any any [sic] property or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule, hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

That I have no occupation but that of a Common labourer that through age and a lameness my shoulders and other infirmities I am unable to support myself by labor, that I have no family, but my wife Charity aged sixty two, weakly and unable to labor. (Signed with his mark) Barnet Dutcher.
