

### **Pension Application for Bryant Eddy**

Can't read any of the depositions.

Letter in folder dated March 20, 1936, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the pension record of Bryant Eddy who died in Ellisburgh, Jefferson County, New York, after 1840.

The data which follow are obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension claim, S.22748, based upon the military service in that war of Bryant Eddy.

Bryant Eddy was born December 25, 1760, in Canaan, Connecticut. The names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in Great Barrington, Berkshire County, Massachusetts, Bryant Eddy enlisted and served with the Massachusetts Troops, as follows: from July 1, 1777, six weeks as a private in Captain Peter Ingersoll's Massachusetts Company, Colonel John Brown's regiment and was in frequent skirmishes from May 15, 1778, as a private in captain Enoch Noble's Company, colonel; Ezra Wood's Regiment and was discharged February 7, 1779; from July 18, to October 23, 1780, as a private in Captain John Spoor's Company, Colonel John Brown's regiment; from August 6, 1781, as corporal in Captain Jeremiah Hicok's Company, Lieutenant Colonel Sear's Regiment, was in the battle of Johnstown and was discharged November 8, 1781; in 1781, three months in Captain Thomas Ingersoll's company; no details of this service given.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 11, 1832, while a resident of Ellisburg, Jefferson County, New York.

There are no data in regard to soldier's family.
