

Pension Application for Jacob Edegh (Ittig)

Disability

Edegh, Jacob

His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of New York, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on April 25, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, Page 93.

Rank: Private (1)

Regt: Col. Bellenger's

Disability: Wounded in the back by a tomahawk by the Indians.

When and where disabled: Sep. 1779 Thompson's place. (2)

Residence: Schuyler.

Remarks: Wound of no consequence. There are no militia rolls in this office.

Evidence transmitted by the District Court incomplete, viz: Disability from known wounds not proved.

End Notes for Jacob Edegh—Disability

1. Jacob Ittig is listed as serving as a private in Captain Henry Harter's Company in Colonel Peter Bellinger's Fourth Regiment of Tryon County Militia. Jacob is listed also as serving in Captain Henry Staring's Company in Colonel Bellinger's Regiment.
2. Most likely he had been on a scout when attacked. Several pensioners mentioned scouting tours to that area.
