

Pension Application for William C. Eldridge

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of “An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the army of the revolution” approved on the 15th of May 1828, I William C. Eldridge of Salem in the County of Washington and State of New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the army of the Revolution, for and during the war, and continued in its service until its termination, at which period I was a private in Captain Stanton’s Company in Colonel Sheldon’s Regiment of the Connecticut line—and I also declare that I afterwards received a certificate for the reward of eighty dollars to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the 15th of May 1778. And I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of march 1828 or at any other time before or since on the pension list of the United States. Dated July 3d 1828. (Signed) William C. Eldridge.
