

Pension Application for John Enders or Endres

W.19230 (Widow: Elizabeth)

State of New York

Schoharie County SS.

On this 12th day of February 1845 personally appeared before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas [Pleas] now holding in and for said County Elizabeth Ender's a resident of the town and country of Schoharie and state aforesaid in the 75th year of her age, who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath, make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 7, 1838 entitled an act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows.

That she is the widow of John Enders, who was a soldier in the Revolutionary war as she has been informed and believes. That he belonged to Captain Strubrach's Company in Col. Vromans Regiment, as she also has been informed but she cannot state, from personal knowledge anything in relation to his service.

She further declares that she was married to the said John Enders on the 10th day of May seventeen hundred and ninety.

That her husband the aforesaid John Enders died in the month of March 1825 in the 74th year of his age.

That she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first day of January seventeen hundred and ninety four, viz, at the time above stated. (Signed with her mark) Elizabeth Enders
