End Notes—Service Record—John Flander

1. Jacob Klock was appointed Colonel on August 26, 1775 of the Second Regiment of Tryon County Militia.
2. John Flander served as a private in Captain Nicholas Richter's Sixth Company, Captain John Hess' First Company and Captain Peter Waggoner's [Wagner] Company in Colonel Klock's Regiment. No particular dates are given for the time or length of service. Captain Richter moved out of the area after April of 1779 and Captain Waggoner's Company was formed in 1780. Waggoner had served as the first lieutenant under Captain Hess but by 1780 either Hess had resigned or the company was divided into two companies.
