I James Fletcher of the Original [Genen?] of Tully in County of Onondaga and State of New York being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God do depose and say that I entered and was mustered in New York under Capt. Wiley in the New York Line in the Continental army in Col. McDougal's Regiment and transferred into Capt. Lyon's company soon Afterwards enlisted in the fall of the year 1775 after the battle of Bunker's hill served nine months and discharged at Fishkill barracks by Col Willett enlisted again immediately at the same place during the war under Capt. Thomas DeWitt in the Third New York Regiment commanded by Col. Gansevoort afterwards transferred into Capt. Liker's Company into Col. VanSchaick's Regiment in the New York line and served during the war was wounded in the leg at the battle of White Plains was discharged near NewBurg in the State of New York in the summer about hilling [lenn?] time of the year 1783 by Lieut. Col. VanDyck John Livingston near Capt. [Lepes?] Orderly Sergeant and by means of the wound I received in the war other misfortunes, I am so reduced in my circumstances that I want relief from my county for support. [???] my discharges are both of them lost. (Signed with his mark) James Fletcher
