

Pension Application for John Folliard

Declaration.

I John Folliard of the City of Hudson in the county of Columbia in the State or New York, DO, according to the act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and "Naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war," make the following Declaration under oath, that is to say: I do solemnly declare that I am a resident citizen of the Untied States, to wit, in the town, county and state aforesaid, and that by reason of my reduced circumstances in life, I am in need of assistance from my country for support. I do further declare, that I was a private soldier in the War of the Revolution, and that I served as such in the said war of the revolution, against the common enemy, until the end of the said war, for the term of about seven years on the Continental Establishment.

That I belonged to the company commanded by Capt. Abraham Livingston in Col. Livingston's regiment, and in the line of New York – And I do further declare, that I entered the said service in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy six and left in the year—one thousand seven hundred and eighty two was transferred to the regiment commanded by Col. VanCortlandt in the said line of New York in the company commanded by Captain Pell—and left the said service in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty three having left the same by reason of the expiration of my said term of enlistment at which time I received a regular discharge; but which I have since casually lost.

And I do further declare, that I hereby relinquish all claim to every and any pension heretofore allowed me by the laws of the United States,. Witness my hand this thirtieth day of September in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen.
