

Pension Application for Isaac Ford

Bradford County SS.

On this 12th day of September AD 1820 personally appeared in open [open] Court of Common Pleas being a Court of Record holden at Minneville in and for the said County of Bradford in the State of Pennsylvania aforesaid Isaac Ford aged fifty four years and resident in the said County of Bradford who being first duly sworn doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows that on or about the last of May in the year 1782, he enlisted at Newburg in the State of New York in a company commanded by Captain McWoody in the Regiment of Artillery commanded by Colonel John Lamb of the troops of the line of the State of New York on the Continental Establishment and that he served in the said Regiment until about the last of May 1785, when he was discharged at West Point in the said State of New York.

And that on the 7th day of June 1818 under the Act of Congress passed the 18th Day of March 1818 he made application for the provision thereof and received a certificate of Pension dated the 7th day of September 1819 numbered 15022.

And I the said Isaac Ford do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818.

And that I have not since that time by gift, sale nor in any other way dispose of my property or any part thereof with intent to diminish it so as to bring myself within the provision of and [an] act of Congress entitled and act to provide for said persons engaged in the land an Naval Service of the United States in the revolutionary war passed the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due me nor have I any income other than what is contained in the Schedule hereunto annexed and by me subscribed.

SCHEDULE

One cow, three sheep, one pig.

A note of forty dollars against Hiram Warn that he absconded 6 years ago and the note out lawed & man never heard of since.

Names of myself and family of Isaac Ford aged fifty four laborer but unable to labor, Mary Ford aged fifty years insane & infirm. (Signed) Isaac Ford
