

Pension Application for Peter Fradenburgh or Fredenburgh

On this 8th day of April 1919 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas for said county personally appears Peter Fradenburgh resident in said County who after being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and Navel service of the United States in the Revolutionary War".

That he the said peter Fradenburgh enlisted in the State of New York the last of February 1776 in the company commanded by Captain McCrtacken in a Regiment commanded by Colonel VanSchaick in the New York line for a term of one year and continued to serve in the said Corps the full term of his enlistment and received a written discharge which is lost.

That he again enlisted into the army of the United States some time in the year 1777 for during the was under the same officers as above and continued to serve in said corps to the close of the war and received his discharge in the State of New Jersey which he has [?] lost and further he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support.

John Fradenburgh being duly sworn deposeth and saith he knows that Peter Fradenburgh enlisted into the army of the United States in the revolutionary war and that he served as a soldier a number of years in the same. Sworn 8th April 1818

And further the said Peter Fradenburgh has no other evidence now in his power to his said services. Sworn and declared before in the day and year aforesaid.
