

Bounty Land for Joseph Freligh

B.L.WT.732-200

Lieut. New York Line

Issued Mar. 3, 1794 to Timothy Benedict Assignee.

No papers on file because of the destruction of the War Office by fire in 1800.

Excerpts of letter dated June 27, 1933, written in response to an inquiry.

The records of this office show that Warrant 732 for two hundred acres of bounty land was issued on account of the service of Joseph Freligh, Lieutenant of the New York line during the Revolution, said warrant was issued March 3, 1794 to Timothy Benedict, assignee.

There are no papers on file containing statements made in the application for the land, because of the destruction of such papers when the War Office was burned in 1800, therefore, this office has no further data relative to Joseph Freligh.
