Pension Application for Benjamin Fuller

S.13098 [Not much legible in this file and what I could read was set forth in this letter.]

Letter in folder dated January 2, 1935, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your letter in which you request information in regard to Benjamin Fuller, soldier of the War of the Revolution in the New York Militia.

The data furnished herein were obtained from the papers on file in pension claim, S.13098, based upon the military service of Benjamin Fuller, during the Revolutionary War.

While residing at Batten Kill, he enlisted in the summer of 1780, served as a private in Captain Adial Sherwood's New York Company; he was taken prisoner at Fort Ann and carried to Montreal, Canada and held for "more than one year" then sent to Prison Island in the St. Lawrence where he was confined part of the time in irons until the falloff 1782, when liberated.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 18, 1832, at which time he was living in Queensbury, Warren County, New York, where he had lived since returning from Prison.

He died August 10, 1837, leaving children; their names are not stated, nor is the name of his wife given.
