

Pension Application for Daniel Fuller

W.1847 (Widow: Anna W.) Anna W. Holmes and Daniel Fuller married July 4, 1838. He died July 21, 1847. B.L.Wt.6404-160-55.

State of New-Hampshire.
County of Hillsborough, SS

On this third day of July A.D. 1833 personally appeared in open Court before the Court of Probate, now sitting at within and for the County of Hillsborough, in the State aforesaid, Daniel Fuller a resident of the town of Francestown in said county aged 72 years who being duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress, passed June 7th 1832. That he entered the service of the United States, under the following named officers, and served as herein stated. That is to say,

About the first of July 1780 he enlisted for six months and afterwards served said term out in Capt Stevens (or Stephens) company of artillery which belonged to Col. Lamb's regiment of artillery in Gen Knox's Brigade. Soon after he entered the service his company was attached to Gen. Pearson's Brigade & passed from Robinson's Farms near West Point where he joined the company into New Jersey & was stationed at English Neighborhood, Orangetown, [?] & Peramus [Paramus] & other places until they returned & built huts and went into winter quarters at or near New Windsor in the State of New York. That the officers of his company whose names he remembers were Lieut Wearing, Lieut Allen.

He entered the service in the month of July following. He received a written discharge from the service but it is not now in his power & he does not know what has become of it. It was signed, he does not remember by whom.

He was born at Didham in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Nov 5, 1760 has no record of his age. When called into the service he lived in said Didham. Since the Revolutionary war he has lived in the same place and in Francestown N.H. where he now lives. Hon. Peter Woodbury & Hon William Bixby of Francestown are persons in his present neighborhood who can testify as to his character for truth and to heir belief of his services as a soldier of the Revolution.

He relinquishes every claim, whatever, to a pension or annuity, whatever, except the present, and declares that his name is not on the pension roll, of the agency of any State. (Signed) Daniel Fuller
