

### **Pension Application for Samuel Gardenier**

Letter in folder dated August 4, 1915, written in response to an inquiry.

Sir:

In response to your letter dated the 27<sup>th</sup> ultimo, you are herewith furnished the history of the pensioner (Sur. File No. 35,336) Samuel Gardener. He is the only Samuel Gardner of New York troops, Revolutionary War, under any spelling of the name for whom any papers are on file in this Bureau.

You are further advised that in the Report from the Secretary of War in relation to the pension establishment of the United States, which was printed in 1835; on the list of invalid pensioners of the New York Agency whose residence could not be ascertained in consequence of the burning of the War Office in 1801 and in 1814, appears the name Samuel Gardenier, Private, Army of the Revolution, annual allowance \$60, died December 31, 1806.

This bureau has no further data relative to said Samuel Gardinier owing to the burning of the papers in his claim.
