Andrew Gardiner being duly sworn says—that in the month of July seventeen hundred and seventy eight he enlisted as a soldier in the Continental army of the United States—in the regiment of Colonel Louis Dubois—in the company commanded by Capt. Henry Dubois—he joined the army at White Plains the same month in which he enlisted—In consequence of an arrangement which took place, some time afterwards he was placed in the regiment No 2 of the New York line—he was present at the siege of Yorktown and capture of Cornwallis—and served in the army of the revolution about five years—and that in the month of June seventeen hundred and eighty three—received his discharge—but which he has since lost—The regiment to which he belonged was disbanded at Snake Hill in the County of Orange in this State—And further this deponent states that he is upwards of sixty of age—is in great [indigence?] & urged by his poverty to apply for relief and further saith not.
