

### **Pension Application for Jesse Gardner**

W.3409 (Widow: Martha) Married August 26, 1784. Jesse died January 8, 1815.

Since this soldier didn't live long enough to collect his pension, the letter which was written November 5, 1926 in reply to an inquiry about this man's service during the Revolutionary War.

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim W.3409, it appears that Jesse Gardner, while a resident of Goshen, Orange County, New York, enlisted in 1778 and served nine months as private in the New York Troops, no officers stated.

He afterwards enlisted (no date given) and served in Captain Fowler's Company, Colonel Philip VanCortland's New York Regiment was in General Sullivan's expedition against the Indians, and at the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown and was discharged in 1783.

He died January 8, 1815.

Soldier married August 26, 1784, Martha Carpenter. She was allowed pension on her application executed November 23, 1844, while a resident of Pittstown Township, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, aged seventy-nine years. In 1848 she was living in Providence, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania.

Son, Jesse is the only child mentioned, and there is no further data on file as to family.
