

**Pension Application for Jeremiah Goldsmith**

On this twentieth day of April 1818 before me the subscriber one of the Judges of Ulster Common Pleas in & for the County of Ulster in the State of New York personally appears Jeremiah Goldsmith aged seventy six years resident in the town of Wawarsink in the said County of Ulster who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the late Act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land & Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" that he the said Jeremiah Goldsmith enlisted at the City of New York in the company commanded by Capt. Quackenbush in the first New York Regiment commanded by Col. Richmore (as the said Jeremiah believes) in the year 1775.

That he continued in the said corps until the 8<sup>th</sup> day of March 1776 when he was discharged from service at Headquarters before Quebec in Canada at which time he received the original discharge from general Arnold to this deposition annexed, that he was in the Battles of St. John and Montreal during the aforesaid enlistment.

That he the said Jeremiah Goldsmith again enlisted at New Windsor in the State of New York in company commanded by Capt. Peter Mills in Col. Baldwin's Regiment of Artificers in the month of August 1777. That he continued to serve in said corps until the 1<sup>st</sup> September 1780, when he was discharged form service at Head Quarters in the State of New York at which time he received the original discharge from Ezekiel Samson Lieut & Col. Baldwin commandant of Artificers to this deposition annexed.

That he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support. (Signed) Jeremiah Goldsmith
