

Pension Application for James Gray

On this fourteenth day of April 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court of the State of New York, personally appears James Gray aged eightyone years, resident in Schodack in the said state who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war."

That he the said James Gray enlisted in Schodack in the state of New York for the term of one year in the company commanded by Captain John Fisher in Col. Vanschaick's Regiment of the New York Line in the Continental Establishment' that he continued to serve in the said crops, or in the service of the United States until the January enlistment expired which was one year when he was discharged from the service Schodack state of New York that he was in the battles of Saratoga at the Johnny Burgoine and had his honorable discharge in writing which discharge is lost.

And that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. (Signed) James Gray
