

Pension Application for Daniel Green

W.16277 (Widow: Mary)

The copies in this file are not good, so I am using the typed reply to an inquiry which was dated November 4, 1939.

Reference is made to your letter relative to Daniel green who served as private in the New York troops from 1776 to 1779, in the Revolutionary War.

The data which follow were obtained from the papers on file in the Revolutionary War pension claim, W.16277, based upon the military service in that war of Daniel Green.

Daniel Green was born April 2, 1760, in Wallkill, Orange County, New York. The names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in said Wallkill, Daniel Green enlisted in 1776, and served at different times on short tours until 1779, about one year and twenty four days in all, as private under Captains Samuel Watkins, Tilford, John Little, William Faulkner, Jacob Dewitt, Bailey and Isaiah Vail, Colonels Nicoll, McClaughrey, Hathorn and Phillips in the New York troops.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 1, 1832, while residing in Minisink, Orange County, New York. He signed Green.

He died August 4, 1833, place not shown.

The soldier married September 6, 1782, Mary Gillson. They were married at the home of her father in the Village of Middletown, Town of Wallkill, New York. Marcy was born October 6, 1763. The place of her birth and the names of her parents are not shown.

She was allowed pension on her application executed December 22, 1838, while residing in Minisink, New York.

Jesse Green born April 25, 1802, in 1838, was living in Minisink, New York.

Israel Green born May 25, 1807.

Absolam Green born April 8, 1809.

Adeline Green born June 21, 1813.

One John Green and his wife attended the marriage of Daniel Green and Mary Gillson; no relationship was shown.

In 1840, Joseph Gillson, a brother of the widow, Mary Green, was residing in Deer Park, Orange County, New York, and was aged sixty-nine years.
