

Pension Application for John Green

Wayne's War

Letter in folder dated December 20, 1935, written in response to an inquiry.

The data contained herein are obtained from the papers on file in the Revolutionary War claim for pension, S.36552, based upon the military service of John Green in that war.

The date and place of birth and names of the parents of John Green are not shown.

John Green enlisted in Peekskill, New York, about January 1777, served a private in Captain Samuel Sackett's Company, Colonels Henry B. Livingston's and Weissenfels' New York Regiments and in captains Theodosius Fowler's and John Francis Hamtramck's Companies, Colonel Philip VanCortlandt's Second New York Regiment and was discharged in 1783 at the close of the war. he afterwards served in the army of the United States under General Wayne, no further details of this service given.

He was allowed pension on his application executed April 10, 1818, at which time he was about sixty-seven years old and a resident of New Milford, Litchfield County, Connecticut.

In 1820 soldier referred to his wife, Eunice, her maiden name not stated, aged sixty-three years and his two daughters, their names and ages are not shown. There are no further family data.
