

### **Pension Application for Philip Hanor**

W.16285 (Widow: Ann Maria) Married Fall of 1789. Philip died March 6, 1837.  
State of New York SS.

#### Declaration

On this 9<sup>th</sup> day of August 1832 personally appeared in open court before Daniel Gardner Recorder of the city of Troy in the Mayors Court not sitting.

Philip Hanor a resident of the City of Troy County of Rensselaer and State of New York aged seventy three years who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress passed June 7<sup>th</sup> 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein after stated.

In the year seventeen hundred and seventy five in the month of October I entered a private in a company commanded by Capt. George Sharp in the Regiment commanded by Col. Stephen T. Schuyler and continued to serve in said company for the term of nine months at different times and places viz started from Col. Stephen Schuyler's and march'd up to Fort Ann and continued their three months the year following in the month of Sept. I went on an expedition under the same officers John Fonda was Lieut, to Caughnawaga, laid there one month or more in the year 1777 went up to Schoharie under Capt Shaw, Col Butler had the command and continued there one month same year under Capt. George Sharp went up to Fort Edward in the month of Sept and continued their [there] for the term of one month at this time about six miles on this side of Fort Edward at a place called the Moses Kill I was one of the picket guard was attacked by the troops of Gen. Burgoyne and the action continued from about six oclock in the morning until about 4 oclock in the afternoon when we retreated and went to Saratoga and from their march to Stillwater where I was taken sick and was discharged in the year 1778 in the month as near as I can recollect of Sept went up to Schenectady under Capt. Gorge Sharp Major John Fonda and continued their [there] one month or more and from their went up to Fort Hunter and continued their one month when I was discharged and came home.

In the year seventeen hundred seventy nine Inlisted [enlisted] in a company of Rangers commanded by Capt. John Riley, Riniear VanEverin Lieut David Barrenge was Orderly Sergent [Sergeant] and continued in the service of this company going form place through the country as I was discharged by the Capt for the term of nine months as near as I can now recollect enlisted in this company in the spring of the year.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency any state. (Signed with his mark) Philip Hanor
