

Disability Information for Joseph Harris

Dis. No papers, New York Agency

Letter in file dated July 1, 1933, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your letter of June 23, in which you request the Revolutionary War record of your ancestor, Joseph Harris, who you state was wounded in battle and received a pension. You also state in your letter that the records furnished you by this office of Joseph Harris, S.44391 and Joseph Harris, R.4647, do not contain the information you desire.

This office has no general genealogical data on file.

In the report of the Secretary of war in relation to the pension establishment of the United States, printed in 1835, the name Joseph Harris appears on a list of Invalid Pensioners, who have been transcript of pensions at the Agency of New York, and whose residence could not be ascertained, in consequence of the destruction of the papers, when the War Office was burned in 1800 and in 1814.

Said list shows that Joseph Harris was a private and was pensioned from September 2, 1818, under the Act of April 27, 1810, on account of disability.

There are no further data, relative to this man, due to the burning of papers, as described above.
