Dear Sir,

I must beg leave to trespass on your in requesting your aid in behalf of an aged lady in this City—Charlotte Hazen the widow of General Hazen of the Revolutionary Army, was allowed a pension of two hundred dollars an year and received it semiannually for several years past. She is now informed that it will be necessary for her to obtain a Certificate at War to enable her to have this sum paid to her at the office at New York, where she has heretofore received it. Permit me sir to Intreat [entreat] the favour of you to obtain this paper on her behalf, and forward it by my friend John W. Taylor who will deliver it to me. I am with Great Respect. Your most obedient servant. John Taylor.
